

“Strippy Flower Block” for the Jelly Roll Sampler

You will need (1) 2 ½” x width of fabric of background fabric and (3) different 2 ½” Jelly Roll Strips. It may help you to cut a small swatch of each and mark each A, B, C, or D.

From (A) fabric cut (4) 2 ½” x 2 ½” squares

From Fabric (B) cut (2) 6 ½” x 2 ½” pieces AND (2) 4 ½” x 2 ½” pieces

From Fabric (C) cut (2) 6 ½” x 2 ½” pieces AND (2) 4 ½” x 2 ½” pieces

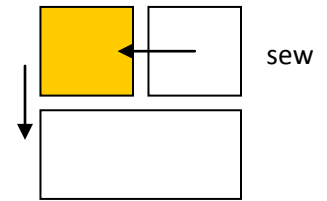
From Fabric (D) cut (4) 2 ½” x 2 ½” squares

From the background fabric (shown white in this image) cut the following pieces:

(12) 2 ½” x 2 ½” squares AND

(4) 4 ½” x 2 ½” pieces

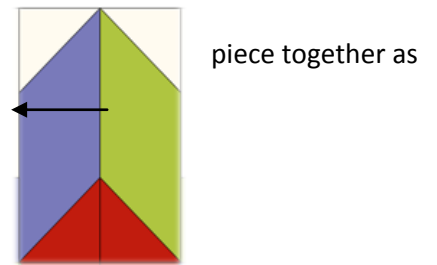
1. Sew the 2 ½” background square to the (A) square, press seam to the dark. Then this unit to the 4 ½” x 2 ½” background piece. Make 4 of these units.



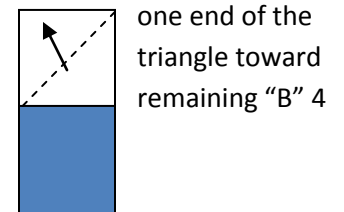
2. Draw a line diagonally across the back of (1) 2 ½” background square (1) “D” fabric square. Place on opposite ends of the “B” 6 ½” x 2 ½” piece as shown. Sew along the diagonal line, and press the triangle toward the corner. Trim off the two layers of excess fabric at the back. Repeat with the remaining “B” 6 ½” x 2 ½” piece and with the (2) “C” 6 ½” x 2 ½” pieces.



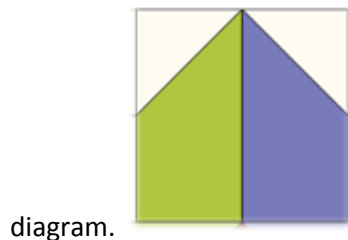
3. Pin and sew one fabric “C” 6 ½” x 2 ½” piece and one fabric “B” 6 ½” x 2 ½” piece together as shown in the diagram.



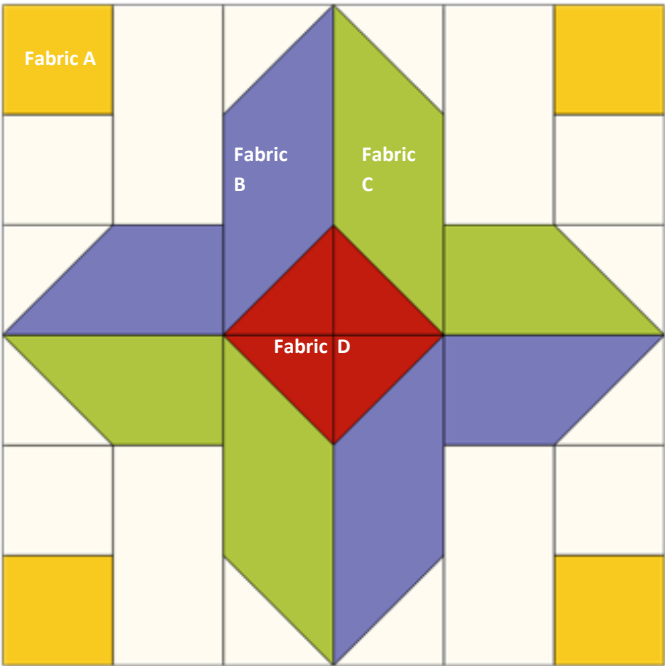
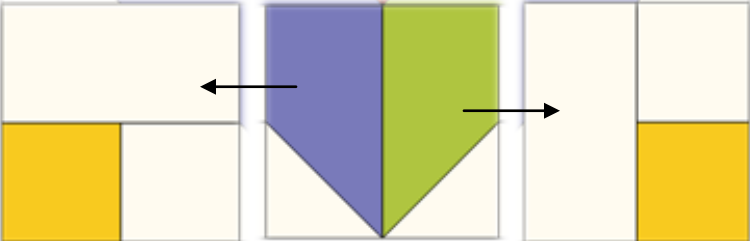
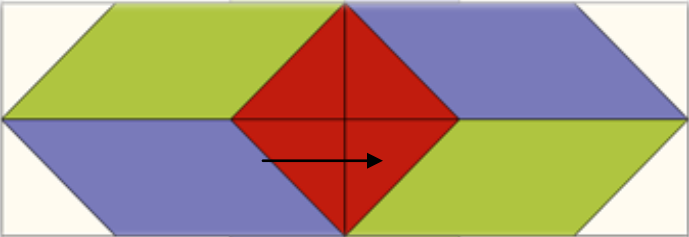
4. Draw a line diagonally across the back of (1) 2 ½” background square. Place on “B” 4 ½” x 2 ½” piece as shown. Sew along the diagonal line, and press the the corner. Trim off the two layers of excess fabric at the back. Repeat with the ½” x 2 ½” piece and with the (2) “C” 4 ½” x 2 ½” pieces.



5. Pin and sew one fabric “C” 4 ½” x 2 ½” piece and one fabric “B” 4 ½” x 2 ½” piece together as shown in the



The block goes together as follows:



Press the seams and square up to 12 1/2".
